Editorial



While preparing for this Editorial on Sunday, January 27, 2019, I tried to google "enjoy learning". Here is what I got: about 3,160,000 results (about 30,600 results on Google Scholar). I narrowed down my inquiry and searched for "ways to enjoy learning", I found about 228,000 results (about 14 results on Google Scholar). Whereas "how to enjoy learning" had 885 results (69 results on Google Scholar), "reasons to enjoy learning" had 4 results (2 results on Google Scholar) and "how and why to enjoy learning" had only 1 result (0 result on Google Scholar). As a matter of fact, these numbers put me out of track; my purpose was not to examine 'how' Google functions and 'why' I got all those numbers. After spending half an hour trying to understand how google functions, I felt that I wasted my time on useless inquiries and numbers for the Editorial. Hence, I decided to go back to the first inquiry about "enjoy learning". When I scrolled down the page, I found a Eureka title to start with. It was "3 Ways to Enjoy Learning—WikiHow". I surfed it; it contains the following methods: a) 'Making School More Fun', b) 'Continuing Your Education', and c) 'Understanding the Benefits of Learning' [1]. Although it contained many useful ways "to make learning fun", I felt that this is not all what I'm looking for. So, I moved to YouTube. Here I found another list of results. I asked myself, which ones shall I watch and how much time shall I spend on that task? I started to click on some titles like "A Love of Learning" [2], "10 Steps to Love Learning Again" [3], and again, Eureka, I came across "Dr. Mark Stevens Teaches Students How to Experience Academic Confidence and Enjoy learning" [4]. The speaker kept me focused till the end; Stevens is a university professor, a psychologist and the director of CSUN university counseling services who introduced himself as "a dream navigator", and thus I considered him a good reference to my Editorial. He presented 7 steps "to enhance motivation and enjoyment of learning for college students", as CSUN Career Center stated (2014). I won't summarize here his talk; I will leave that task to your curiosity, interest, and time to find out what those steps were and how you can benefit from his experience. Later, I came across a TEDx talk entitled "The Importance of Learning. Learning What Exactly?" [5], given by Daniel Pavluts who was in 2012 the Minister of Economics of Latvia. I thought it's always good to have a diversified approach, and wondered, asking why not to watch it since the speaker comes from the world of politics and numbers. But then, I said to myself, I need to listen to something totally different, new, inspiring, and of course, to add a flavor to my inquiry. And again, Eureka, it was another TEDx talk given by Robert E. Grant, an entrepreneur, inventor and investor. His talk was on "Beautiful Minds are Free from Fear" [6] in which he focused on how we can be "the masters of our fate" and "the captains of our own souls". Finally, I noticed that the time allocated to write my Editorial has ended; I reflected on what I did, smiled, and confessed that this morning experience was exactly what I needed to enjoy learning!



The OR Program in the Words of an OR Assistant

When it comes to transitioning from high school to university, students may find themselves in need of a little guidance. At heart, they are both academic institutions yet they do have slight changes. Haigazian University offers a great Orientation Program, in which students get a full grasp of how university life is like and how it works. The Orientation Day consists of a series of sessions offered by various faculty members. In this way, students get to meet some of their future professors, get to see their dean, the campus minister, and the university counselor. It creates a space of familiarity between the students and the faculty members. That space extends to the university's campus and soon to be classmates. Students get a real feel of how their coming years will be like. The Importance of First Impression


