Previously, he has been Director of the Master of Public Health Program in the School of Hygiene and Public Health at Johns Hopkins;

Professor of Epidemiology at the AUB;

Coordinator of the Interfaculty Research project for the study of the Status of Children in Lebanon;

Dean of the Faculty of Health Sciences at the AUB;

Coordinator of the In-Service Development with the Ministry of Public Health in the State of Qatar;

Commissioning Officer of Health Centers with the Ministry of Health, State of Bahrain.

Dr. Armenian has received the Movses Khorentasi Presidential Medal of Service and Accomplishments in the Republic of Armenia 2001; and in the same year, a Fellow at the royal College of Physicians in London.

From 1992-1999, he has been editor of the American Journal of Epidemiology. He has authored, edited, co-authored a few hundreds of works that you may research later.

- Valuing his background in both Lebanon and the Armenian community as well as his professional experience;
- Extending a hand of fellowship to the AUA and Armenia in general;
