## PRESIDENT'S WORD

Most of who we call founders do not realize at an early stage that they were really founders. People start projects based on needs and dreams. Then they take a step of faith and move on.

There are four FOUNDERS' names we give tribute to today: Stephen Mehagian; Stephen Philibosian; Rev. Puzant Kalfayan; Rev. Hovhannes Aharonian, and of course, many others who assisted in one way or another.

Stephen Philibosian was 17 when he arrived in the USA to work with his uncle and make money and return to his Armenian home in Cilicia. The Massacres of Adana took place in 1909 so he never returned.

Stephen Mehagian had earned a BA in Tarsus but then jailed by the Turkish authorities, escaped through bribing his captors and deported. He passed through Syria, Lebanon and Egypt before he arrived at UCLA to continue his education and return home to Cilicia and serve his people. While away he received news of the massacres that reached his family (parents and three sisters we killed).

So, two men, who saw disasters, but succeeded in life and then turned into serving the future generations! These people of financial success in the USA were also people of faith and dedication and turned disaster into new life and opportunity. Their financial commitment brought about the establishment of HU, but it was also Rev. Aharonian in Beirut, and Rev. Kalfayan in NY, who provided the institutional and church backing for the realization of a dream we all benefit from today, 56 years later.

Now, a new academic year has started. We are already attending classes and labs, teaching and administering, planning and organizing activities. Our first focus as students is on changing <u>our</u> world, strengthening <u>our</u> skills and attaining <u>our</u> education and <u>our</u> degree. At the same time, we may or may not realize that each of us has an impact on others already and now. We influence each other for the better or the worse. Beyond serving ourselves, we already have a mission for the betterment of our world: our friends and families, community and country.

Young people are given the gift of critical thinking and high expectations. Ideals will move you forward. This includes self-critical thinking as well.
